The Duke (12A)

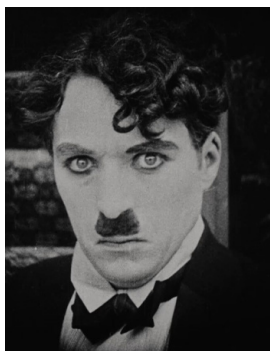
